SERVICE BOOKLETS

Braille and large print service booklets are available from the Chapel Administrator for Evensong and Sung Eucharist services.

CHORAL SERVICES

Services are normally sung by King's College Choir on Sundays and from Tuesdays to Saturdays. Services on Mondays are sung by King's Voices, the College's mixed voice choir. Exceptions are listed.

ORGAN

During January and February the organ will be undergoing repair, and the solid-state piston action will be upgraded.

ORGAN RECITALS

While the organ is out of action the usual recital series will be suspended: other recitals will take place as listed in this booklet.

HOLY WEEK AND EASTER SERVICES

This year sees the fifth festival of music for Holy Week and Easter, *Easter at King's*, in which a series of concerts complements the traditional services. Details of the concerts and how to book tickets appear later in this booklet.

MEMORIAL SERVICE

There will be a Memorial Service to commemorate the life and work of Mr Peter Avery, OBE (KC1958) on Saturday 7 March at 2.30 p.m.

MUSIC

The second year of *Concerts at King's* brings the distinguished American choir, VocalEssence Ensemble Singers, to the Chapel, under the direction of Philip Brunelle, whose son Christopher (KC 1989) read classics and sang as a choral scholar. The series continues with a concert featuring the music of Professor Robin Holloway (KC 1961) and other works chosen by him. Robin read music at King's and is now a Fellow of Gonville and Caius College. The last of the *Concerts at King's* which falls this term is a celebration of Mendelssohn, marking the 200th anniversary of his birth in 1809. The concert includes the *Violin Concerto*, played by Magnus Johnston, a former King's chorister.

On Sunday 8 February the Dante Quartet, the College's resident string quartet, accompanies the Choir at the Sung Eucharist.

The fifth annual *Easter at King's* festival marks the 200th anniversary of Haydn's death with a concert to include the *Trumpet Concerto*; the 250th anniversary of Handel's death is marked by performances of *Messiah*, in which the Choir is joined by the Academy of Ancient Music; these forces also give Bach *St John Passion*; the distinguished ensemble from Leipzig, amarcord, perform vocal music for Holy Week; the BBC Singers give the first performance of a new work by Judith Bingham, and the festival closes with a recital by Simon Preston (KC 1958), the internationally renowned organist who was Organ Scholar at King's.

Messiah is to be broadcast in cinemas throughout Europe and North America, and the Choir's broadcast of Evensong on Wednesday 11 March offers a further celebration of Mendelssohn.
