INTRODUCTORY NOTICES

WELCOME *from* THE DEAN

This term we intend to enjoy returning to a much more normal life in Chapel. We no longer require those who wish to attend to book in advance on Eventbrite, and we will maintain a full set of weekly services to which members of the wider university and the public are warmly invited.

On the first Sunday of term we have the *Sermon Before the University*, given this year by Dr Fiona Godlee, former editor of the *British Medical Journal*. This like all our Sunday morning services (apart from that on Sunday 8 May) is open to the public.

In addition to sermons and homilies from the College clergy, we look forward to hearing addresses from The Reverend Stephen Coles, former Chaplain, on Sunday 29 May, and the First Bursar of King's, Dr Keith Carne, on Trinity Sunday, 12 June. Our series addressing the question 'What is truth' continues with a visit from Dr Daniel Weiss of the Divinity Faculty and Darwin College. I invited Dr Weiss as I was so intrigued by what I heard from one of my students about the third-year Theology course that Daniel teaches and felt that it might open up very interesting perspectives on the way religious thinking helps us grasp truth. I look forward very much to hearing this, and all the other sermons, from our visiting speakers.

At Evensong on Wednesdays the second reading will be an excerpt from *Four Quartets*, by T.S. Eliot. This is a series of meditations—originally published separately—which share common themes of time, meaning and the Divine. This term's excerpts come from the first two Quartets: 'Burnt Norton' and 'East Coker'. They raise questions like: 'How do we perceive time, and how is the Divine—the infinite—discerned in lives that are bounded by time?'; and 'where is meaning in the midst of repetition and finitude?' Eliot's questions concern us all, and leave us wondering . . .

ORGAN RECITALS

This term we are delighted to return to our pre-Covid format of weekly organ recitals following Evensong on Saturdays. Alongside Paul Greally (organ scholar) we have organ scholars from across the University playing a composite recital on 7 May. Visitors this term include Benjamin Nicholas (Merton College, Oxford), Francesca Massey (London) and former Organ Scholar, Dónal McCann (New College, Oxford). Admission is free and all are welcome.

MUSIC

The College Choir returns to Chapel after a successful Holy Week and Easter Festival. Forthcoming highlights include: some items from our recently released album *Now the green blade riseth* in the first few weeks of term; Byrd's *Mass for five voices*, which makes a welcome return to the repertoire when we commemorate our Founder on 20 May; and, amongst various pieces of new music, Matthew Martin's *In the year that King Uzziah died (I saw the Lord)*, which can be heard on Trinity Sunday, 12 June. As usual, the music at the very end of the academical year is chosen by departing choristers and choral scholars.

King's Voices sings weekly on Wednesdays, under the direction of Ralph Woodward. On 29 May they will sing a joint service with Ralph's other choir: the Fairhaven Singers.


