Welcome from the Dean

I look forward to welcoming members of the public and the wider University to join us at services and concerts through Term. All those attending, other than current members of King's, need to book their place in advance, and this can easily be done free of charge through Eventbrite, either by using the QR code on page 5, or through the College website via the link at the bottom of this page. If none of that works for you, please call into the King's College Visitor Centre on King's Parade.

In addition to public services, we offer some services and chaplaincy events exclusively for current students, staff and Fellows. Details of these are posted on the College intranet, on the 'Attending Chapel Services' page.

At Evensong on Wednesdays the second reading will be an excerpt from *Four Quartets*, by T.S. Eliot. This is a series of meditations—originally published separately—which share common themes of time, meaning and the Divine. This term's excerpts come from the first two Quartets: 'Burnt Norton' and 'East Coker'. They raise questions like: 'How do we perceive time, and how is the Divine—the infinite—discerned in lives that are bounded by time?'; and 'where is meaning in the midst of repetition and finitude?' Eliot's questions concern us all, and leave us wondering...

The Revd Sarah Atkins, Chaplain of Magdalene College, will preach on Quinquagesima Sunday, 27 February; we look forward to welcoming her. Additionally, we will hear a sermon from Yvette Day, Master over the Choristers, as well as addresses from Fellows Professor Alan Macfarlane and Dr James Dolan, who will be responding to Pontius Pilate's question to Jesus, 'What is truth?', from the perspective of their own academic disciplines. Prof. Macfarlane is an anthropological scientist and Dr Dolan specialises in science communication.

At Evensong on 6 February we will commemorate Dr Erika Swales, Life Fellow of King's, who died in July 2021. Dr Swales had been a Fellow for over forty years, and was a long-time Director of Studies in Modern Languages. This service will be open to the public, as usual.

On Saturday 19 March we will hold a memorial service for former Director of Music and Life Fellow, Sir Stephen Cleobury. Sir Stephen died in November 2019, but the pandemic has delayed our collective wish to commemorate and celebrate his life, achievments and huge contribution to the life of this Chapel. Admission to this service will be by invitation only; we regret that we will be unable to admit anyone without an invitation.

Looking ahead to next term, the *Sermon Before the University* will be given at Matins on Sunday 1 May and the Bishop of Ely will conduct a service of Confirmation on Sunday 8 May.
